	 focus of IFFTI should be on more layered research encompassing culture and design and should not only be scientific. We should have our own style. We need to have guidelines for this. We should look at Research from quality aspects and focus on taking something new to the Conference which is deep and which could then be taken forward at separate breakout sessions. Over the next 5 years IFFTI should become an authority on research in Design and Culture and lay down its guidelines for institutions to follow. He suggested that we should have a separate Conference Sub-Committee which should work on these aspects. The Conference package should therefore clearly define the instructional guidelines for review and selection of papers. 5.4 Dr. Su-Lee Tsai informed the Committee that they had received a total of 161 abstracts of which only 95 were selected to submit full paper. Of these 62 were finally accepted to present their papers at the Conference. She was candid, to accept that if strict norms of quality were implemented, only 10% of these papers would have qualified for presentation. (a) Clause 8(b)
