MS. TINA GUGLIELMINO PROPOSAL FOR IFFTI SUB-COMMITTEES OPERATION

Nomination Process

Current process for call for nominations to stay in place with the addition of a request of 500 word supporting documentation addressing capability of nominee and specialist area to undertake task of committee. This could be proposed specifically for the Research and Finance Sub-Committee in light of the capability required.

Election of Chairs to Sub-Committees

- 2. Elections of Chairs for Sub-Committee to be voted on by Executive committee or alternatively by calling for volunteers from Executive Committee or alternatively by nominations from the Executive Committee. It is recommended that all members of the executive committee hold Chair or Deputy Chair position and are on sub committees. Chairs of Sub Committees should have been members of the executive for at least two years or previously experienced on the IFFTI Executive. It is advisable that newly appointed executive committee members hold Deputy Chair where possible.
- 3. In an exceptional case, where it becomes necessary to appoint a Chair from outside this group owing to professional reasons (such as Research Sub-Committee), then such Chair should be co-opted to the Executive Committee.

Numbers required

4. The membership numbers on each Sub-Committee may vary according to the number of volunteers and to represent a fair and equitable number of representatives from across institutes and regions with one member from any institute on a Sub-Committee. This may need to be reviewed if membership numbers are low.

Research Sub-Committee

5. Chair and Deputy Chair from Executive Committee plus members up to a manageable number approximately minimum of 6 and maximum 16 providing strong participation is consistently achieved.

Education Initiatives Sub-Committee

6. Chair and Deputy Chair from Executive Committee plus members up to a manageable number minimum of 6 and maximum 16 providing strong participation is consistently achieved.

Finance Sub-Committee

7. Chair and Deputy Chair to come from the Executive Committee plus 2 additional members from the General Council that are not represented on other committees with appropriate financial expertise.

Membership Sub-Committee

- 8. Chair from Executive Committee plus up to a manageable number providing strong participation is consistently achieved. In order for evaluations to be consistent it is proposed a team of 4 to 6 undertake the assessments.
- 9. Recommend that due to poor consistency of subcommittees in the past that membership be reviewed and reported on by Chairs of Sub-Committees regularly.

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ELECTION OF NEXT EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

At the 13th IFFTI Annual Conference held at Institut Français de la Mode, Paris on 12th April 2011, the General Council had agreed upon the following composition, and procedure for election, of the next Executive Committee.

(a) Composition:

(i) The Executive Committee will henceforth comprise Regional Members elected from the four regions of Americas, Europe, Asia and Oceania in the following proportion:-

Americas – 2 Regional Members
 Europe – 3 Regional Members
 Asia – 3 Regional Members
 Oceania – 2 Regional Members

(ii) The Chairs of Sub-Committees would preferably be elected from amongst the Regional Members. However incase it becomes necessary to elect a Chair of a Sub-Committee from outside the Executive Committee members, then the Chair of that Sub-Committee will be co-opted on the Executive Committee in addition to the Regional Members.

(b) <u>Election Procedure:</u>

- (i) The Secretary will call for nominations from the General Council for election of additional Regional Members to the next Executive Committee.
- (ii) After receiving the nominations, the Secretariat will ask the 'Regular' Members of the General Council to vote to elect additional 'Regional' Members from amongst the nominated institutions.
- (iii) The Secretary will table the documents in respect of nominations and voting at the next Executive Committee meeting scheduled to be held at Bunka Gakuen University, Japan on 13th & 14th October 2011. The existing Executive Committee will then finalize the composition of new Executive Committee.
- (iv) The composition of the new Executive Committee will be communicated to the General Council through the minutes of the 26th Executive Committee meeting scheduled to be held at Bunka Gakuen University, Tokyo, Japan in October, 2011.
- (v) The new Executive Committee will convene at the opening session of the Executive Committee meeting scheduled to be held at Pearl Academy of Fashion, India in March, 2012 and elect the next Chairperson and the Deputy Chairperson of the new Executive Committee.
- (vi) The new Executive Committee will also elect the new Chairs and Deputy Chairs of the Sub-Committees and co-opt additional member(s) to the Executive Committee, if necessary.
- (vii) The new Executive Committee will assume office at the 14th Annual Meeting of the General Council scheduled to be held on the next day at Pearl Academy of Fashion, India.

Tasks undertaken:

2. In pursuance of the above decisions, the Secretariat had called for nominations for election as Additional Regional Members. The nominations received are summarized below:—

- (c) <u>Asia:</u> One member from amongst Bunka Women's University, Japan and Fu Jen Catholic University, Taiwan.
- (d) <u>Oceanias:</u> One member from amongst School of Architecture and Design, Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology, Australia and Otago Polytechnic, New Zealand.

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COMPOSITION OF NEW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

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INTERACTION WITH IAF

At the 25th Executive Committee meeting at Institut Francais de la Mode, Paris, the Committee had invited Mr. Harry Van Dalfsen, President of IAF to join the meeting. Mr. Harry Van Dalfsen explained the revised IAF organisation. IAF now functions through 3 Sub-Committees namely, 'Education', 'Technical' and 'Global Responsibilities'. He stressed that he was keen to expand the cooperation between IAF and IFFTI. The Secretary informed Mr. Harry Van Dalfsen that IFFTI had made some proposals for the consideration of IAF. Mr. Harry Van Dalfsen had assured the Committee that he would discuss the recommendations made by us at the IAF Board Meeting.

- 2. He had subsequently informed that the IAF Board had unanimously accepted all the proposals put forward by us at the Paris meeting. To begin with President IAF has recommended the following:—
- (a) Both the organizations should co-opt suitable members to attend each other's Sub-Committees meetings.
- (b) Promote each other's events through appropriate means.
- (c) He will get the details of the collaboration finalized at the next IAF Board Meeting.
- 3. In this regard, an extract of IAF Education Committee meeting held on Tuesday, 24th May, 2011 at Messe Frankfurt is placed at **Appendix-B** (*Page No. 14*).
- 4. He had also invited IFFTI Chairperson to attend the next IAF Board Meeting scheduled to be held in Mexico from 12th to 16th October, 2011. Unfortunately the Chairperson could not honour the invitation as the dates conflicted with the IFFTI Executive Committee meeting.
