	5.4 Ms. Tina Guglielmino informed the Committee that she had undertaken a survey to determine the growth pattern of IFFTI membership. According to the findings there was an average growth of about 9% per year. If this trend continued we would reach a membership of 108 by the year 2025.it was perhaps an opportune time to reflect on the strategy for our growth. The chart giving the findings is placed Annexure 1. This growth in membership gave IFFTI the chance to look at how it supports the members and their institutions.

Sub- Committee	7.2 She stated that Since 2014 the Sub-Committee has worked with the host institution in developing the conference research stream, including delivery of academic papers, creative works and an annual research workshop, this has involved updating review processes, consistent selection criteria and constructive feedback.	

	 With the support of the IFFTI Executive and General Assembly the Committee will in the future lead the research stream for each conference working in collaboration with the host institution and nominated research leader. The aim of the Committee in expanding this role is to develop rigour in the conference's academic outcomes, in line with best practice and investigate new models of practice. Expanded role of the research sub-committee to include the following changes to membership and responsibilities: The composition of the research sub-committee membership will include representatives from the host institution (to join the sub-committee 2 years before the institution for supporting particular conference styles/ concerns from more traditional delivery to exploratory forms for creative practice, and to reinforce the peer review process and ensure high quality outcomes. Each host institution will allow IFFTI to manage the peer review process and members of the sub-committee. The sub-committee will be consulted in the appointment of the session chairs to assist with managing the sessions. For 2017 conference it is recommended that a member of the sub-committee will attend an onsite meeting to discuss themes set by the host, abstract submissions, likely numbers, facilities etc. 	Prof.Robyn Healy
	 Reviewers for academic papers will be invited by members of the sub-committee to ensure that reviewers have relevant experience and are representative across the regions and research areas. <u>Review of terms of reference and 5 year plan</u> At 2017 conference the sub-committee will present a 5-year plan identifying priorities, potential areas of growth, including research exchange programs, collaborative projects and professional development opportunities. <u>Research Blog</u> The research blog will be launched post conference – opportunity to use this to engage more regularly with members with research issues.
